

OVERVIEW

Across the globe, women are spearheading movements in communities large and small – and changing our world in the process. SOAR, a new initiative of the Aspen Institute Forum on Women and Girls, is designed to spark inspirational, bold conversations and spur action that transforms the lives of women and girls around the world.

The <u>2020 SOAR Leadership Series</u> is an opportunity to hear from diverse women leaders across generations and all segments of society and reflect on challenges that women and girls face in your own community. Through their stories, we hope that you'll learn from their journeys and look toward building on their successes.

Whether you plan to attend, have already attended, or are interested in hosting a viewing party to watch the Leadership Series, this guide is tailored for you. In this guide, we outline everything that you need to consider, coordinate, and share your experience, including:

- How to host a watch party
- How to have a rich discussion
- How to share on social media



WATCH PARTY

I want to be a SOAR host - What do I do?

Remember, you don't have to attend the SOAR Leadership Series in person to experience the power of the series. Whether you're huddling around a friend's laptop or gathering with a large group at your local coffee shop, there are many easy ways to learn, reflect, and inspire other women in your community — like hosting a watch party, facilitating a discussion, or engaging with the event on social media.

If you're interested in hosting a watch party for the <u>AFWG 2020 Leadership</u> <u>Series livestream</u>, first take time to consider some simple logistical questions regarding content, attendees, location, and other details. The following outline is a helpful guide for anyone interested in becoming a host.

WHAT

Think about the purpose of your watch party and the issues that inspire you to bring people together.

Ask yourself:

- What are the issues that affect me and the women and girls in my community?
- What ground rules are in place for my watch party?
 (e.g., speaking time, listening time, making a brave space)
- What do I want attendees to gain from our conversation?

WHO

Think about who you want to invite to your watch party. What voices and perspectives should be part of the conversation? Be intentional about diversity, inclusivity, and representation within your community.

Ask yourself:

- Who do I want to invite? (Examples below)
 - People in my community who care about women's and girl's issues;
 - Women leaders working at the forefront of my community or behind the scenes; and
 - Voices of women most affected by the issues highlighted in the leadership series.
- Who do I trust to have an open, honest, and respectful conversation about my hopes and fears for women and girls?
- · Who do I respect and want to learn from?

WHERE

Think about the location of your watch party if you are gathering in person. Consider comfortable spaces with privacy for open conversations.

Ask yourself:

- Where should my watch party take place?
- Are there places within my community that would host the event? Consider places of worship, community centers, college campuses, women-owned small businesses, or a home.

If some, or all, of your group can't meet in person, that's OK. Join virtually:

- Be sure to all participate in the chat that takes place during the livestream.
- Connect after you watch the leadership series and have a reflective conversation on the phone or by video chat.

DISCUSSION GUIDE

I'm inspired and motivated - What's next?

Imagine that you've watched the livestream at your party or just heard an amazing recap from one of your attendees – what do you do next? Think about your role in continuing this conversation and the various ripple effects around the world. How do you want your watch party to inspire others? How will you move the needle?

Now is the time to lead a discussion about what you just heard and experienced as a group. This discussion can look and feel a variety of different ways, and the guide below will help organize the flow of discussion topics and ensure that each person walks away with a call to action.

PART 1: REFLECT

Take five minutes to reflect. Ask everyone to write two things, thoughts, or ideas that resonated with them after watching.

Ask the following questions:

- What touched you? Why?
- What did you find most interesting or inspiring?
- Did the speaker's story challenge you or your current way of thinking about something?
- How would you describe the speaker's leadership style?
- Do you see yourself as a leader in your home, community, work, or anywhere else?
- What's your leadership style?
- What did the speaker teach you about leadership?

PART 2: ENVISION CHANGE

Now that you've discussed the speaker and your immediate reactions, pivot to the community at large.

Ask the following questions:

- Where do you hope to see change in your community?
- What keeps you up at night about women and girls in your community?
- What is an urgent challenge facing women and girls in your community and globally?
- How does this challenge disproportionately affect women and girls in your community?
- What's your vision or big-picture roadmap of what your community might look like if that challenge didn't exist?

PART 3: TURN INSPIRATION INTO ACTION

Your next step is to think about how to transform your inspiration into action. Start by expressing a commitment to taking on the challenge you noted in the discussion.

Engage your audience:

- Go around the room and say your pledge out loud.
- Listen to everyone and think about how to support and keep one another accountable.
- Write your pledge on a commitment card.

NEXT STEP: ACTION PLAN

Download the <u>Action Plan</u> and print one for each attendee.

Use this time to think about the impact that you want to have in your community and what this Leadership Series has motivated you to act on.
